
About Malad Kandivli Education Society

LL.B. (3 Years)

ADMISSION GUIDELINES FOR SUBSEQUENT YEAR

For each subsequent year, students shall fill in a fresh admission form of College and University Enrolment Form and pay the necessary fees on or before the date fixed.

Candidates for being eligible for admission to the Second / third Year of 3-year- LL.B. course or Second / Third / Fourth/ Fifth Year of 5 Year B.A. LL.B. Course must have either passed in the examination of the previous Semester or must have got exemption in at least six papers (excluding practical training paper) of the first and second semesters and follow the guidelines of University of Mumbai

Enrolment

For Admission in Second Year in LL.M. shall be as per University norms, students shall fill in a fresh admission form of College and University Enrolment Form and pay the necessary fees on or before the date fixed.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND FEE DEDUCTION

Candidate shall apply offline handwritten letter for cancellation along with the fee receipt mentioning the reason for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees will be as per rules prescribed by the competent authority or the University of Mumbai. No refund once the session commenced.

The institution shall cancel the admission immediately and generate online acknowledgement of cancellation of admission through institution login and issue a signed copy to the candidate.

The refund of fees before cut-off date of admission schedule declared by the Competent Authority shall be made within weeks' time after deducting the processing charges of Rs.1000.

If the admission is cancelled after the cut-off date of admission declared by the Competent Authority, there shall be no refund except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit.

NOTE: The students are advised to preserve their fee receipt carefully.

Refund of deposits / admission cancellation fees will be made only by a cheque on submission of the original fee receipt.

Standard of Passing The Examinations

The performance of the learners shall be evaluated into two components. The learner's performance shall be evaluated by Internal Assessment with 25% marks as the first component and by conducting the Semester End Examinations with 75% marks as the second component. The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 Out of 75) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E, wherever applicable, to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination together.

LL.M.

The Curriculum & Examination Pattern for LL.M. is as per University of Mumbai. The LL.M Course follows the Semester System and is of duration of 2 years (Four Semesters). The academic year, which consists of two terms, begins in July and ends in May. The LL.M. course is available in six specializations. (Groups), the college provides the below mentioned three Specialization:

- Group II Business Law
- Group III Law of Intellectual Property and Information Technology
- Group V Criminal Law and Criminal Administration

Standard of Passing

To pass LL.M. examination the candidate must obtain 45% marks in each paper and 50% aggregate in each semester. Those successful candidates who obtain 55% to 59% Second Class 60% and above First Class. The Class will be awarded on the basis of the total performance of the student in all the four Semesters. However, a student claiming exemption will be entitled to pass class only. The dissertation shall be evaluated by a team of teachers of the concerned group and External Expert nominated by College Committee. The Marks shall be awarded after joint consultation by both the evaluators. A student may be exempted at his choice from appearing in any of the papers, if he has secured at least 50% of the total marks in that paper. Students failing in Dissertation/Project and Viva Examination in the Fourth Semester shall again undergo for the Dissertation and Viva as the case may be. The final approved dissertation shall be submitted on Cdrom in addition to two hard copies. The same procedure shall apply to failure in Choice-based credits. All research projects, dissertations & other research assignments are required to be in accordance with the circular of the University of Mumbai dated 15th June 2018, no. Exam./Thesis/Uni/VCD/947 of 2018 and University Grants Commission (Promotion of Academic Integrity & Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulation.

SEMESTER SYSTEM

The Law degree will not be conferred upon a candidate unless the candidate has passed in, or cleared all the papers prescribed for each Semester examination in accordance with the provisions relating to each Semester examination. The performance of the students will be evaluated by the Examination to be conducted at the end of the every Semester and also by his/her performance in the Practical Training and DPC Papers as per the guidelines issued from time to time by the Bar Council of India & University of Mumbai.

Medium of Instruction: English Only

Teaching Staff: The Teaching staffs of the college consists of full time teachers and visiting teachers who are either recognized post graduate teachers for law college or persons of eminence in the filed of their specialization.

Teaching methods: classroom lectures, interactive sessions & discussions, case studies, powerpoint presentation & documentaries, seminar & workshops, mooting (debating points of law before a judge), guest lectures, practical training, project work field visits etc.

♦ Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT)

- a) Students shall be allowed to keep term for Semester 2, 4 and 6 of the 3 years LL.B. programme and Semesters 2, 4, 6, 8 and 10 of the 5 years B.A/LL.B. programme irrespective of number of heads of failure in the Semester 1, 3 and 5 of the three years LL.B. programme and Semesters 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 of the five years B.A/LL.B. programmes respectively.
- b) A student shall be allowed to keep terms of both the semesters of the higher semesters of the law programmes if he has not failed in more than 2 subjects/courses out of the subjects/courses of both the semesters of the respective law programmes taken together of the immediately preceding year and has passed in all the subjects/courses of all the semesters of the respective law programmes preceding to the immediately preceding semesters of the year he is seeking admission. (e.g. students seeking admission to the third year (semesters V and VI) of either of the LL.B. programmes shall have to pass in all the courses of the semesters I and II and shall also have pass in any six courses of semesters III and IV taken together) However, the same shall not be applicable to the pre Law Course i.e First and Second Year of B.A.I.B.
- c) The result of Semester VI of the three years LL.B. program or of Semester X of the five years B.A.LL.B program shall be kept in abeyance until the student passes in each and all of the subjects/courses of all the courses in all the semesters of the respective law program.

Attendance

The term's 'working days' means that the days on which the lectures are delivered. As per the University Ordinances No. 6086, a student is considered to have kept term: Every bonafide learner shall ordinarily be allowed to keep terms for the given semester in a program of his/ her enrollment only if he/she fulfill at least 75% of the attendance taken as an average of the total numbers of lectures, practical's, tutorials etc. conducted by the college A student whose attendance in both the terms is not satisfactory (as per Rules of University of Mumbai ordinance 0.6086) will be subject to disciplinary action. The decision was taken by the principal shall be final.

Leave of Absence: In case students are not able to attend lectures and/or tutorials for a period exceeding a week in a term, they should give intimation to the Principal of the College and take prior permission for such absence.

Absence on medical or other grounds: Absence on medical or other grounds, which is given to the satisfaction of the Principal may be considered a satisfactory reason for absence from lectures tutorials. At the time of granting the terms to a student his/her classwork and other academy inputs would be considered to be of paramount importance. Hence, a student may not be granted his/her terms even if he/she explains his/her absence on medical or other grounds.

The Attendance Committee has been formed to maintain the attendance record of all the students admitted in said academic year

UNFAIR MEANS AT EXAMINATIONS

A students who are found copying or using any unfair means as per University of mumbai Ordinance 0.5050 during the Examination will be punished accordingly. The Unfair Means committee is set up to inquire about the alleged unfair means and practices by the students during any examinations (Internal/External/ Practical) and will follow the procedures and guidelines issued by University of Mumbai under Ordinance 5050.

ANTI - RAGGING CELL

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college premises and outside. Students indulging in ragging other students will be punished as per "The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999" (Mah.XXXIII) published in the Maharashtra Govt. Gazette on 15 May, 1999. Such students will also be expelled from the College and an F.I.R will be lodged with the police against them. Moreover, it will be mentioned in the "College Leaving Certificate" of such students that they are expelled because of their indulgence in ragging. The students found guilty of ragging earlier will not be admitted to this College

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the University Grants Commission has framed UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 which have been notified on 4th July, 2009 in the Gazette of India. These regulations are mandatory for all Universities/Institutions. The UGC has made it mandatory for all students / parents to submit anti ragging related affidavits to the institutions at the time of admission. Now it is brought to the notice of all Universities, Institutions, Students and Parents that these affidavits can be downloaded from the website of UGS and or other related websites.

Further as per revised procedure for Anti Ragging Mechanism vide circular of University Grants Commission no. UGC: D.O. No, F.3-2/2021 (ARC) dated 27-10-2021 & University of Mumbai No. SW/17/of 2021, students are requested to adhere to the guidelines issued by UGC for Anti Ragging Mechanism that are as follows:

1. It is mandatory for each student to submit his / her details on the web sites www.antiragging.in & www.amanmovement .org and read and confirm that he/she & his/her parents/ guardians have read and understood the regulations on curbing the menace of ragging. 2 The student will receive an Email with his/ her registration number and a web link. The student will forward the said link to the college. Please note the Anti-Ragging Helpline no. is 1800 180 5522.

APPEAL TO THE STUDENTS

1. DISCIPLINE

The Hi-tech computer Lab of the college has many latest computer softwares and internet access


MOOT COURT


